Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I love the Psalms. I love the honest emotion of the writers. They speak from the heart; they don't hold back.



Many of us wouldn't speak to God the way the psalmists do because we'd be afraid of offending God. But God has tough skin. He isn't offended by our heartfelt emotions; rather, He would be offended if we weren't honest with Him.

In modern parlance, the Lord loves it when we "keep it real." Real emotion. Honest confession. Heartfelt contrition. Authentic worship. Spontaneous praise.

The Psalms are oozing with real spirituality for people who are in touch with a real, living, loving God. Can your heart relate to any of these thoughts?

"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God" (Psalm 42:1-2).

"My God, my God, why have You forsaken me? Why are You so far from saving me, so far from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry out by day, but You do not answer, by night, and am not silent" (Psalm 22:1-2).

"When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night Your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer. Then I acknowledged my sin to You and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the Lord' – and You forgave the guilt of my sin" (Psalm 32:3-5).

"Praise the Lord, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name. Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits – who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's" (Psalm 10:1-5)

The second service is coming soon, and it will provide another opportunity for us to be honest with God. God will graciously come to us in both services and invite us to respond from the heart. Real emotion. Honest confession. Heartfelt contrition. Authentic worship. And spontaneous praise.

My prayer is for both services to be *FILLED* with genuine followers of Christ – people who have been forever changed by the brutally honest crucifixion and resurrection of the Christ.

May our lives of worship never be fake or half-hearted, but reflect the all-out authenticity of the psalmists. With the psalmists we will praise God from the heart, from hearts that have been forever changed.





attending the Church picnic at Wolfe Wildlife Refuge on September 19th.


All are welcome to join in the fun. We begin the picnic with our 11:00 AM outdoor church service at Wolfe Wildlife Refuge 109th and Laramie.


Frank and Celeste Oslakovic will provide the soda, while Ed Neaves lends his dulcet tone to calling bingo. There will also be games for the children.

Dinosaurs, Creation & You!






Come and learn the true story of creation. All adults are invited to bring a child or children to Faith's VBS.
