Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Post-Easter is a great time of the year. Sure we have to put up with April showers, but those April showers bring blossoms to May flowers and lead to the beauty of summer.

Post-Easter is also a great time in the church year. It is the time to celebrate light and life through Christ. He became our Life by being shrouded in death and liberated in resurrection.

One of my favorite post-Easter stories centers on a conversation between Jesus and Peter. Jesus and His eleven disciples were sitting on the beach eating breakfast. After they finished the meal, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “Simon son of John, do you truly love Me more than these?”

“Yes, Lord,” he said, “you know that I love you.”

Jesus said, “Feed My lambs.”

Again Jesus said, “Simon, son of John, do you truly love Me?”

He answered, “Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.”

Jesus said, “Take care of My sheep.”

The third time He said to him, “Simon son of John, do you love Me?”

Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, “Do you love Me?” He said, “Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You.”

Not once, not twice, but three times. Why does Jesus keep repeating this question? Why does Jesus keep badgering Peter? Not once, not twice, but three times.

Perhaps that little phrase – “not once, not twice, but three times” – rings a bell with people who have just come through the wintry days of Lent. It certainly rang a bell for Peter; that’s one of the reasons why he “was hurt.” For Peter knew his past. He had denied knowing his Lord not once, not twice, but three times.

Peter denied knowing Christ, but our Lord still loved him to death and loved Him back to life. He reinstated Peter as a disciple. From that point on Peter was more than a follower of Christ, he was also a leader for Christ. He was chosen to be a pastor, to lead the sheep for the Good Shepherd. He was appointed to feed the sheep in the stead and by the command of Christ.

I love this story. Maybe it’s because I am a pastor who identifies with Peter. I keep stumbling. I keep denying my Lord. Jesus Christ knows my past failures, but He still loved me to death and He keeps on loving me back to life.



The wonderful post-Easter season of life is here. The world around you is springing back from death to life. May it serve as a daily reminder of God’s love for you in Christ – a Love that went to death and came back to life to revive you as His beloved disciple.

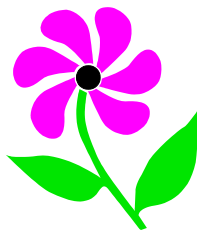
## Spring Outreach

If you are a Senior, please join us.

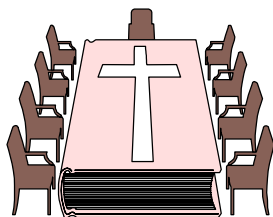
