#### "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return."

Remember that Friday morning when Adam, your Dad was formed. Remember how God took two handfuls of red clay, shaping them into arms and legs, hands and feet, head, chest, tummy and back. Remember that the Lord knelt over Adam, took his head in His hands and gently filled his lungs with the breath of life. Remember how Adam's eyes blinked open and he looked his Maker in the eye. Remember how lonely Adam was by himself in the garden all alone. Remember how happy he was when the Lord made a wife for him from one of his ribs. Remember the peace and harmony of the garden. Remember how Eve, your mom, listened to the serpent and ate from the tree. Remember that Adam listened to his wife and turned his back on his Creator. Remember the horror when they realized what they had done. Remember how they hid in the bushes when the Lord came to find them. Remember how they blamed each other and pointed their fingers in anger. Remember the Lord's words to Adam, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return." Remember the tears of sadness as the first family fled the garden to live among the thorns and briars. # February Hymn of the Month

#### Thy Strong Word" (# 578)

This was probably my favorite hymn when I was growing up. I loved the haunting minor melody and the unique rhythms in the music. I didn't understand all the words, but they had real depth. The text was written by Martin Franzmann, one of the few LCMS seminary professors who was never ordained as a pastor. He was especially known for his poetic use of the English language, which really comes through in this hymn. "Thy Strong Word" uses many references to light as a metaphor for salvation. which makes particularly it appropriate to sing during Epiphany.

### March Hymn of the Month

"Cross of Jesus, Cross of Sorrow" (# 428)

This Lenten hymn was first introduced in the LCMS with the 1998 Hymnal Supplement. It was written by an Anglican priest, William J. Sparrow Simpson in 1887 for John Stainer's Oratorio, "The Crucifixion." The hymn contrasts Jesus' divine nature as true God with His suffering and death on the cross. There are ten verses to the hymn, of which we have the first three and the last in our hymnal. I find the original 9th verse especially poignant:

From the "Holy, holy, holy, We adore Thee, O Most High," Down to earth's blaspheming voices, And the shout of "Crucify!"
