Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week, I had a unique experience. I prayed the Commendation for the Dying with two families on the same day, actually within the course of a few hours. Neither of those who were dying were members of our congregation; I was on call for another area pastor who was on vacation and they were both from his church.

Both families had waited until their loved one was near death before calling for a pastor. They saw pastoral care mainly as a last resort, something that they only needed once the medical treatments had failed.

On the one hand, there's something to be said for the attitude that in the face of death, the only true comfort can be found in God's Word. On the other hand, it would have been more helpful if they had called sooner so that both the family and their loved ones could have had the comfort and strength from God's Word before they reached the point of death.

You may wonder when you should call for pastoral care. Although members of our congregation usually contact a pastor for emergencies, it's not unusual for me to hear that someone had been in the hospital or undergone major surgery after the fact.

Pastoral care is for your benefit, not mine. I don't need to know about every illness or doctor's appointment that you have. But any time you are dealing with a situation where you would like to hear God's Word or have some guidance with your prayers, please don't hesitate to call. Even if the situation is not life-threatening, it's always comforting to hear God's Word and pray with someone. I'm also available to bring the Lord's Supper, and to hear your confession and speak God's Word of forgiveness. It doesn't just have to be a health issue; I'm always willing to meet with you to speak God's Word and to pray.

Sometimes people tell me that they know that I'm busy and they don't want to bother me. I certainly appreciate that sentiment, but if I've got something else more pressing to deal with, I will let you know. We may even be able to talk and pray together over the phone, or I can send you an e-mail with some thoughts when I get a chance. In general, my schedule is very flexible, and I can easily accommodate pastoral care needs and emergencies, but if you wait until the last minute to call, there's always a possibility that I might be busy with something else.

If you are not sure whether or not you should call, just go ahead and check in with me, and we can come up with a plan that best meets your needs. I know that some people are more private with their personal situations and others are more open. I can always keep confidential whatever you are dealing with, whether it is a health situation or some other need. Just don't wait until the last minute, so that you can be sure to receive the best possible pastoral care, whatever your circumstance.

Vacation Bible School

Our River of Life VBS was a smashing success. We had thirty one different children attend, including several new families. The children enjoyed learning all about baptism as the River of Life. They learned several hymns as well as parts of the Matins worship service and sang portions of the Small Catechism.

We raised \$240 dollars for our mission project, "Amigos en Cristo." This means we were able to send 48 Spanish Bibles with Small Catechisms (both books bound in one volume) to families in Central and South America and also to Hispanic ministry programs in the United States through the Lutheran Heritage Foundation.

We could not have been successful without all the wonderful help of our volunteers. Thank you to everyone who donated and helped out with VBS.

Upcoming Festival Services

In the month of September this year, two special festivals happen to fall on Sundays.

Holy Cross Day is September 14. The date goes back to 335 AD, when the church of the Holy Sepulchre, built over the place where many believe Jesus was crucified, was dedicated. Our focus is not on the relics of the cross or identifying the exact location where Jesus died, but remembering the message of the cross. We say along with St. Paul, “For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.” (1 Cor 1:18)

On September 21 we celebrate the **Feast of St. Matthew**. Matthew, also known as Levi, was one of Jesus’ disciples who had worked as a tax collector. He is best known for writing the Gospel that bears his name. We give thanks for the merciful love of God who uses all people as His instruments of love.

In verse two, the creedal language of Jesus' conception, death and resurrection is applied to Jesus as the Word of God. The third verse speaks of the healing power of God's Word, and the last verse reminds us of the Word's power in our life to save us.

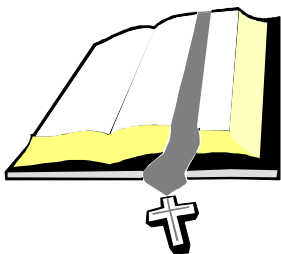
September: "Let Children Hear the Mighty Deeds" (# 867)
