Advent Midweek Services

December 2nd: Lighting of the Christmas Tree

Our Lord works through trees. He placed the tree of life in the Garden of Eden, and used the tree of the cross to bring us salvation. There are no Christmas trees mentioned in the Bible, but we will still give thanks for how the evergreen reminds us of the eternal life we have through Jesus Christ. Join us at 6:00 PM to decorate, and then for a special evening prayer service at 7:00 PM to light and bless the tree.

December 9th: Lessons and Carols

There is an old English tradition to read through the Scripture lessons that both foretell and proclaim our Savior's birth, interwoven with well-known Christmas carols. Our evening prayer service will be based on this tradition.

December 16th: O Antiphons

You probably know the Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." What you may not know is that each of the seven verses of this hymn is based on a series of ancient prayers that were prayed at Vespers (Evening Prayer) during the week before Christmas Eve. We will listen to the Scripture verses that inspired these prayers and sing them together as we await the coming of Emmanuel, "God with us."

A German language Christmas Service will be held at Zion Lutheran Church, 9000 Menard Avenue in Oak Lawn on Sunday, December 13th at 2:00 PM. The preacher will be the Rev. George Mrochen.

Hymn of the Month

Advent: "O Savior, Rend the Heavens Wide" (# 355)

This hymn paints one of the boldest pictures of Jesus' coming found anywhere in our hymnal. Can you imagine Jesus tearing open heaven and bursting through to make a way for you to join Him there? These opening lines are inspired by Isaiah 64:1, "Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence." The other verses present equally vivid pictures of Jesus' coming, first as dew and rain from heaven, then as a flower in bloom, a rising star, and finally the strong arm that leads us "from exile to our promised land."

Christmas Services

Christmas Eve: 7:00 PM

This is our traditional candlelight service. Come to hear the story of the angels and the shepherds and the baby in the manger born for you.

Christmas Day: 9:00 AM

The Christmas Day service focuses on the opening verses of John's gospel, especially these words, "The Word was made flesh and dwelt among us." Come to ponder the mystery of our Lord's incarnation.
