Dear Friends in Christ,

What makes you angry, upset, or concerned? What gets your blood boiling?

A few weeks ago, I was quite upset about the situation with our new organ. There was yet another delay, and plans that we had made needed to be changed. I was angry.

And then I remembered the story of Jonah.

Most of us know the first half of the story: Jonah disobeys God's call to preach in Nineveh. He boards a ship and sails in the opposite direction. A storm comes up, and Jonah is thrown overboard. He's swallowed by a big fish, and after three days, he's vomited up on the shore, and finally he goes and preaches like he was supposed to.

Do you remember what happened next?

Jonah sits at a distance to watch the destruction of Nineveh (he hopes). The sun is hot, but a vine grows up quickly and gives him some shade. But the next day a worm comes and begins to eat the vine, causing the vine to die and Jonah to lose his shade.

Jonah is angry. He says he is "angry enough to die," because he's lost his shade. But the Lord rebukes Jonah. Jonah cares more about that plant than he did for the whole city of Nineveh with its thousands of people, who are all in danger of perishing if they do not repent.

We live in a place like Nineveh. There are thousands of people all around us who do not know the Lord. That's what we should care about. And yet we often get angry and upset about trivial things, like Jonah with his shade, or me with the new organ.

As we move forward this year, let's make sure that we care about what really matters - the people around us who do not know the Lord. And let's do something about it, as God calls us to bear witness to His good news.

## Holy Week Services

### Maundy Thursday, March 29, 7:00PM

We remember the Last Supper of Jesus with His disciples, and we hear Psalm 22 sung as the altar is stripped.

#### Good Friday, Chief Service, Mar. 30, 3:00PM

We hear the passion account from St. John and sing "O Sacred Head Now Wounded." The cross is brought in to the church as we confess our sins and pray for mercy.

# Good Friday, Tenebrae Vespers, March 30, 7:00PM

This service of darkness includes several different psalms, expressing Jesus' loneliness on the cross, and yet it concludes on a hopeful note with the Song of Habakkuk.

#### Easter Vigil, March 31, 7:00PM

Our celebration of the resurrection begins with a new fire and a candlelit procession into the church. We hear the great stories of salvation and remember our baptism. The resurrection is announced, and we celebrate the Lord's Supper.

### Easter Sunday, April 1, 9:00AM

We continue to rejoice in the new life that Christ gives us through His victory over death and the grave.
