We'll probably be offering this at Faith later this summer or in the fall. Connecting people to Jesus is a joyful experience, and I hope that you'll join me in that work here at Faith.

Hymn of the Month

June - "I Walk in Danger All the Way" (#716)

Hans Adolph Brorson is one of the great Danish hymn writers. He is best known for "Behold a Host Arrayed in White" (# 676). Brorson was the son of a pastor and was eventually chosen as bishop. During his time, most Lutheran hymns were only available in German, and so He translated and composed hundreds in the Danish language. The first three verses of this hymn warn us of the dangers we face in life from Satan, sin, and death. The last three verses comfort us with the message that in the midst of the dangers we walk with the angels, and with Jesus Himself, until we reach our heavenly home.
