Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 22, 1939 a small group of Lutherans met in the basement of one of the houses in our neighborhood. They had written to the church headquarters in St. Louis because they wanted a church nearby where they and their families could worship, and that they could use to reach out to their neighbors in the growing community. The folks in St. Louis sent an area pastor to help them get organized, and within a few months, Faith Lutheran Church was born.

Next year we will celebrate the **75th anniversary** of these events, and give thanks for God's blessings over the years. Much has changed; both in our congregation and our community, but the good news of salvation in Jesus Christ has remained the same.

There have been many ups and downs in the past several decades. A few years ago we were looking at options to combine or share resources with other congregations in the area. Thankfully, however, our members have responded generously and the Lord has given us what we need to keep going.

As we look towards the future, several opportunities have presented themselves to improve and enhance our facilities. The church council will be meeting in October to discuss these projects and lay out a course for the next few years. This plan will be presented to the voters in November for further discussion and approval.

Here are some of these projects being discussed:

Chairlifts- The lift we have is aging and cannot always accommodate those who need to use it. We have received estimates both to replace the existing lift and to add a lift to the church basement to provide better access to this area.

Church Basement- Suggestions have been made regarding reconfiguring our current storage area for tables and chairs, providing easier access to this space.

Outside Railings- The cast iron railing near our west entrance to the church needs to be replaced, and some have suggested adding one for the north entrance as well.

There may be other projects that are important for us to consider. In the next few weeks, please keep the leaders of our congregation in your prayers. If you have any specific ideas or suggestions you would like them to consider, please contact any of the congregation leaders. May the Lord continue to bless us now and in the years to come.
