Beloved in Christ,

When you hear the word “faith,” what do you think? A series of statements that you agree with? A fervent trust in someone else?

Your faith is more than just a collection of ideas in your head or emotions in your heart. You are a whole person, and so your faith involves your whole self, including all of your physical senses. Faith involves your head, your heart, and your body, too.

The starting point is with God and His love for you. God’s love for you is a physical, tangible love. It began with God creating a physical world. Then God became a physical person in Jesus Christ. God also gives you your “body and soul, eyes, ears, and all [your] senses and still takes care of them.”

God interacts with you through your senses as you hear His word, are touched by water in Holy Baptism, and eat and drink His body and blood in the Lord’s Supper.

God then calls you to live out this faith in your daily life in ways that give a tangible witness to how He has loved you.

We’ll be exploring these issues in a special program, “Experiencing the Love of Jesus” coming up from 6:00p – 8:00p, August 8-12. Each evening we will take a look at each of the five sense in terms of how Jesus loves us through these senses, and what this means for life in our congregation, home, and community.

Everyone is welcome to attend. This will be an interactive program; we won’t just be sitting around talking, but all of our senses will be engaged.

So bring your whole family. Invite your friends and neighbors. This is a great way to introduce them to Jesus’ love.

Dear Friends in Christ,

I sent out this message via email after a devastating week that saw the upheaval caused by more police shootings, the ambush of policemen in Dallas, and the terrorist rampage in Nice, France. Since then there have been additional attacks in Baton Rouge, Germany, Japan, and France. When we can't seem to find the words to say, we turn to God's word for guidance:

O Lord, how long shall I cry for help,
and you will not hear?
Or cry to you "Violence!"
and you will not save?
Why do you make me see iniquity,
and why do you idly look at wrong?
Destruction and violence are before me;
strife and contention arise.
So the law is paralyzed,
and justice never goes forth.
For the wicked surround the righteous;
so justice goes forth perverted.

These are the words of the prophet Habakkuk.
They seem fitting for our situation today:

All around us we see violence, destruction, and wickedness. Justice is perverted. The innocent are oppressed.

Here is the Lord's answer to Habakkuk, and to you, when you feel the same frustration:

"Write the vision;
make it plain on tablets,
so he may read who reads it.
For still the vision awaits its appointed time;
it hastens to the end - it will not lie.
If it seems slow, wait for it;
it will surely come; it will not delay."
"Behold, his soul is puffed up; it is not upright within him,
but the righteous shall live by his faith."

The last line is key: "The righteous shall live by his faith." It's hard to have faith in trying times, whether the problems are across the globe or in your own home.
